2019 IAFE Convention: San Antonio, Texas

"Champions of Change" was the theme for the annual convention. MAAF members representing 6 Maine fairs traveled to Texas to spend five days learning new and exciting ideas to share with our home fairs. One featured speaker challenged us to consider "A man without a vision is a man without a future. A man without a future returns to his past". Any successful endeavor requires a vision. We learned about a program in New York titled Ag Insider. Folks at agricultural fairs were interviewed, 1-2 minutes, to provide the answers to those questions, such as "How do you give a chicken a bath?" and "What's the difference between Open Class and 4-H?" Urban farming was a well attended program, as was how to create a visual for how many 1/4 pounders in a 1,200 # steer. Trough Talk from the Tulsa State Fair in Oklahoma could easily be added to the educational offerings in Maine fairs. Presentations on e coli, E-gaming, ticketing, fair security, food and beverage rules and regulations, how to maximize your cash flow by introducing non-fair facility rental opportunities and emergency planning. The opportunities for networking with other fair people were plentiful. There are scholarships available to attend the IAFE annual convention in 2020 - Clear Vision is their theme. Consider adding this event to your "bucket list".
